Key Vocabulary	
Clay Slip	A runny mixture of clay and water-clay 'glue'
Impress	Pushing objects into a clay surface to make interesting marks.
Pinch pot	A simple pot formed by pushing your thumb into a ball of clay.
Relief	3D parts of an artwork joined to a flat base.
Score	Marking hatched lines onto a clay surface.
Sculpture	Art in 3D; you can walk around it to look at it.
Surface	The top layer of something.
