
I am delighted to report that children in our school make the progress that the government expects in reading writing and maths in between the end of Y2 and Y6.

Our Year 6 pupils enjoyed the Winsford Primary Pathways event at the University of Chester. The event was designed to support our pupils in exploring a range of careers, subjects and potential pathways before their progression to secondary school. The visit included: a session outlining what options are available, a subject 'fair' which allowed pupils to meet academics; students from a range of our faculties and try activities, and a campus tour. The morning also allowed pupils to experience a real university campus and ask lots of questions.

If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website, turn off your computer if you want to and tell a trusted adult immediately.

Free School Meals And Pupil Premium

You may be entitled to free school meals for your child if you receive any of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal

OR if your child has been adopted or is under a special guardianship order.

Please speak to Mrs Smith in the school office.

It is important that you register, even if your child currently receives Universal Free Infant School Meals as there is additional funding (Pupil Premium) that school can apply for.
