- Recall some facts about events beyond

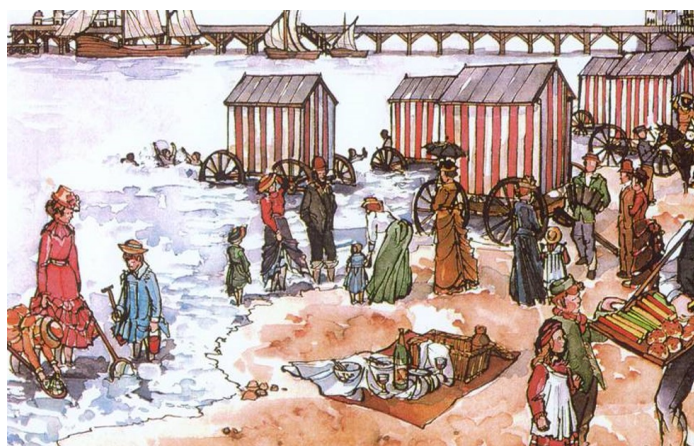
What I will learn next?
