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
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
## Newsletter 7th October 2024

#### **Attendance update:**






Amazing! We have improved whole school attendance compared to last Monday, up to 93.9% and overall this year it is now 93.8%, which is a slight increase. Well done Y1 Mulberry again for having the best class

attendance last week of 97.8%! We are striving to be above 96% for whole school attendance, so please **only keep your children at home if they are really poorly.** Thank you for getting your children to school on time and ready to learn!

### How Attendance is managed at Willow Wood Community Nursery and Primary School

At Willow Wood Community Nursery and Primary School, we use a staged approach to attendance management which is implemented in the following way:



If you get a stage 2 letter, it is because your child's attendance has fallen below 96% attendance. We have had to send quite a few of these letters in the last week, mostly because of the sickness bug that has been going around school, so please don't take offence by the letter. Also at this point in the year, 2 days off is a larger % as we have only been in school for 5 weeks. This will even itself out across the year as long as your child does not have any more days off.

The policy to send letters out to remind parents of their child's attendance % is a Winsford wide policy and all schools in the Winsford Education Partnership (WEP) send the same letters at the same points. Schools are responsible for attendance and are judged by Ofsted on their attendance % compared with the national average which is currently 95.4% and Willow Wood is currently at 93.8%, 2% lower than national. School need to be seen to be doing something about that, so unfortunately children with attendance of less than 96% will continue to get letters.

I'm very pleased to tell you that we have had over 80% of the payments for the Clonter Theatre trip and the World Museum trip, so I'm very happy to say that they are going to go ahead! Though any children who have not paid before the date of the trip will unfortunately not attend the trip and will stay in school on the day of the trip.

## **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium**

Your child may be able to get free school meals/pupil premium if you are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

The criteria also applies if your child is adopted or under a special guardianship order. Please speak to the school office if you need any help with applying or have any questions. It is important that you register, even if your child currently receives Universal Free Infant School Meals as there is additional funding (Pupil Premium) that school can apply for <a href="https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals">https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals</a>
