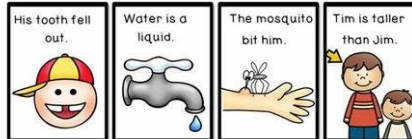
Helping and Being Helped

What is a **FACT**?

A fact is something that can be proved to be true, it is not subject to change.



What is an **OPINION**?

An opinion is something that you believe, think or feel, it is subject to change. It cannot be proved true.



Key Vocabulary

Adult	A grown up mature person.
Carer	A family member or paid helper who regularly looks after a child or a sick, elderly, or disabled person:
Check	A test or search to make sure that something is correct or in order.
Fact	Something known or proved to be true.
False	Something that is not true, fake or artificial.
Online	Connected to a computer network.
Opinion	Somebody's own viewpoint about someone or something.
Parent	A mother or a father.
Safe	Providing protection from harm, loss, or danger.
Search	To look through very carefully in order to find something.
