Bible	The sacred writings of Christianity.
Bread of Life	God sent Jesus down to nourish the world.
Cross	The symbol of the Christian Religion.
Crucifixion	The sacrifice that Jesus made so humans would get eternal life in heaven.
Easter	A Christian holiday to celebrate that Jesus Christ returned to life after he died.
God	The supreme being that is worshipped by Christians
Good news	Spreading the message of God.
Good	The title that Christians give Jesus.

Light of the world	The phrase "Light of the world" in Christianity primarily refers to <b>Jesus Christ</b> , and his light in a dark world.
Messiah	The anointed one or chosen one.
Resurrection	A reurn to life after death.

Symbols	Icons or images, such as the cross in Christianity.
Trinity	In Christianity, the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost,
